BLOCK OF THE MONTH

April Block of the Month Corrections:

Cut Four 2 ¹/₂ inch green squares for corner 2 and cut Four 1 ¹/₂ inch green squares for corner 1.

Crazy Quilters-May Block of the Month

Pastel "Pinks" Flowers April 13 Due-May 11

April showers bring May flowers in lots of pretty print pinks

Were making a flower block that looks like it has triangles, but in fact we are "snowballing" the corners of the pink fabrics.

The block will look like this:



And you will cut the following to prepare your flower

Cut:


- Four 2 1/2:" squares green corner 1

Four 4 1/2" squares of petal color -- PINKs

- Four 1 ½" squares green corner 2 (Same color as corner 1)
- Four 42 squares soft/pale yellow for corner 3 14^{b}

Snowball the appropriate corners as shown in Figure 2. Trim excess fabric from corners leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Pay attention to the correct corners to sew squares to.

Sew the four petals together and your block should measure 8 1/2" UNFINISHED

PHILANTHROPY AND CLUBHOUSE 4

We at Clubhouse 4 have all been busy making blocks of the month, Blockhead blocks, and individual endeavors for our Firemen and Veterans. A few people work on their own projects. We really have a good time, and, we laugh often and loud.

To those of you who may not be interested in our Philanthropic efforts, we still welcome resident members at our "quilt room" who do their own quilting thing. It is not a requirement that you "do" philanthropy. Although I admit it is encouraged as a way for us to pay back (or pay forward) to better our world and brighten other lives.

Now, about our recipients. Social Services Friendly Visitor program is to help our neighbors who are shut-ins and are unable to get out to socialize. A trained visitor sees them a couple of times a month so they are not so isolated. Long Beach Veterans Administration (Spinal cord injury units, there are 4 or 6). This is to let the Veterans know they are not forgotten. Orangewood Children's home is Orange County's version of an orphanage. Children are triaged ASAP to Foster Care rather than being warehoused in an institutional environment. Many are removed from their homes with nothing of their own, sometimes home isn't great. Our quilts are given to these kids for them to keep as their own, often it is the ONLY thing they own. Orangewood takes quilts in all sizes, because kids come in all sizes. Scrappy quilts are great! Put your scraps to work. At Camp Pendleton we help Navy Marine Relief (Vanda is part of this organization). They help young couples who have no clue what is involved in caring for a new baby.

To help you with your quilting we maintain a "store". We have fabrics in limited quantities for private projects where you may only need a fat quarter or so. "Free" if it is a Philanthropy project, "cheap" if it is not a Philanthropy project. Our store depends on your donations. We do not buy fabric to resell.

We look forward to seeing you on Thursday afternoons 1 - 4 pm at Clubhouse 4.

Thank you to Corinne Cesvet for the armload of baby quilts, and Leila Konow for fabric for the store.

I will try to reserve our room at Club House 1 for Friday as many of you are busy with other classes in emeritus during the early part of the week.

A small payment is given the instructor to compensate her time and work in putting the workshop together. I will keep the cost to \$15 and include lunch. Other guilds have teachers that cost upward of \$300 for a workshop--we can't do that, so we Crazy Quilters will do it our way as we do with so many things and have fun doing it.
