
FEBRUARY Meeting: 'New Member Recognition Luncheon'. Last date to RSVP if you have not

# Block of the Month January 2016

Please turn in your block no later than February 11, 2016

# Half-Square Triangle Overload Quilt

We will be using a lot of half-square triangles this year in the Block of the Month Quilts for Philanthropy.

For January you will need:


2-6 inch squares of light/medium fabrics, and

2-6 inch squares of medium/dark fabrics

They should be of the same color family such as medium blue and dark blue, or red with pinks, or light greens with medium greens. We are trying to make a large, colorful quilt to pass onto one of our philanthropic groups.

NO NOVELTY PRINTS , NO WHITE, MUSLIN, BROWNS OR BLACKS EITHER, PLEASE.

Place a light square on top of a medium square, right side together (RST) and draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the lighter fabric. Sew an exact quarter inch away from either side of the drawn line using <u>12-inches to the inch stitch length</u>. Then cut each square set on the drawn diagonal line. Press to the darker fabric, you now have four half-square triangles, place all half-square triangle in the same direction and sew together as a four patch block. Your block should measure approximately 10 5/8 inches square, PLEASE do not trim your block(s). See diagram below.




# Friendship Star

Hello again, more HST'S (half square triangles) this month.

Cut as follows:

- 1 B 4-1/2 inch square Blue
- 4 A 5 inch square Light\*
- 2 D 5 inch squares Light print Red\*
- 2 C 5 inch squares Blue\* Same color as B





\*To be squared up to 4-1/2 inches after sewing into half square triangles. AND BEFORE SEWING into block.

Place an A block on top of a D block, draw diagonal line corner to corner and sew <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch on either side of line. Make 2, yields 4 half square triangles.

Next place an A block on top of a C block and sew as previous squares, make 2, yield four HST.

Here's the layout for the block. PLEASE remember a ¼ inch seam is very important to put these blocks together, so please measure your seam allowance and a 12/in SL. Finished block should be approximately 12 ½ inches square.

Ladies you did a Fantastic job! The cupboard is beautiful! So now when you want to make a project for one of our philanthropic projects you may contact Lynda Guthrie, Judy Dimmick, Leila Konow, Nancy Allen or Jeanne Stone on Thursday afternoons or Tuesday nights. We will be happy to help you select fabric for PHILANTHROPIC projects. This fabric is not for sale for personal projects. Bring us your pattern and a list of what you will need and we will help you pick out the right stuff. As always, we will help you layer smaller projects, provide batting and backs for philanthropy quilts.

This year's goals are: 13 quilts 70" x 90" (or close) for the fire Department; 20 or more quilts for Long Beach Veterans Hospital Spinal cord units 70" x 80"; five or six for the Veterans Memorial Retirement home in Santa Monica 70" x 80"; 20 lap quilts for Social Services Friendly visitor program; 100 quilts for Orangewood Children's Home (OC's answer to orphanage). These can be any size, kids come in the newborn to teenage sizes; ? gently used blankets / quilts for South County Outreach for people living in their cars or on the streets.

The loose threads friendship group has an on-going project of supplying baby things to Operation Baby shower for wives of lower ranking enlisted personnel whose spouses are deployed and family is not local.

This is a fun project for some very giving men and women. Hope you will participate. Give Lynda a call.


