


## Block of the Month March 2016

Please turn in your block no later than April 18, 2016

Two-Color Star of Triangles



Let's go more masculine this month with Tans and Blacks.



NOT TO SCALE

You will need to cut squares and then make half square triangles. This time the size of the squares is smaller. Cut 4 squares 3 1/8" in Tan A

Cut 4 squares 3 1/8" in Black B

NOTE: Half-squares triangles should measure 2 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" square.

Cut 8 squares 3 1/8" in a "warm" Cream (only) C

Join 4 Black squares with 4 Cream squares drawing a line diagonally from one corner to another and sew on both sides of the line, cut apart and press to the black. Do the same with the Tan squares, pressing the to the brown.

Lay out the squares in four rows per the diagram above paying attention to the direction of the triangles. Join squares in rows and then rows into the square. Your block should measure 9 inches square. If not check your seam allowance!

PLEASE remember a ¼ inch seam is very important to put these blocks together, so please measure your seam allowances and stitch with 12 stitches per inch stitch length not basting stitches, they come out too easily!

I will be in the sewing/quilting room on Thursday following the general meeting to assist you and answer your questions. *Thank you for your participation*.
