BLOCK OF THE MONTH (BOM)- By Ann Ainsworth

January's BOM will be a disappearing nine-patch floral that is super cheerful to stave off any January blues, plus it's very quick to complete. Kits will be available at the January meeting.

We're announcing February's BOM early so you can all search your stash, and ours, for any fabrics you may want to use. We would like you to make any 10-inch square size block in a house theme (it will be 9-½ inches square when sewn to the other blocks). It can be any design you want – applique, pieced, embroidered or even a 10-inch square of house print fabric would be fun if your machine is down or your schedule is full. The only stipulation is that it has to be able to be washed, so applique has to be stitched down well as it is going into a quilt, not a wall hanging, so only use a very light weight bonding agent to keep it soft.
