Quilts to Long Beach VA Hospital and Veterans Retirement Home in LA

Our president, Vanda Bresnan and her husband Mike go to Long Beach every week to play cards with the patients. Vanda and Mike will take the quilts to the hospital for us. There is space in their car for a passenger or two if you would like to go along and visit the patients and hand out quilts. Contact Vanda Bresnan.

Instead of storing the quilts for a long period of time, we will give them to Vanda when we have about eight to 12 quilts and she will get them to the hospital. We have been giving them to the patients in spinal cord unit, but Vanda will inquire at the volunteer office to see if another unit is in need of some attention.

It is not so much the quilts, but the bit of conversation we give the patients when we deliver the quilts. Remember, many of them are far from home - some will return to a facility near their homes and some will have Long Beach as their home for some time.

Quilts for Our Firefighters

A year and a half ago, Marily Stone-Benjamin and Lynda Guthrie went to our firehouse to ask them if they would like some quilts. They were so excited and couldn't believe that we would make quilts for each of them.

You Crazy Quilters went to work and we completed enough for one shift (13). Now we had two shifts to go. Many of you that quilt at home, made a complete quilt for a firefighter and handed it in. We labeled them for the firefighters and stored them.

As you know, I am the temporary Philanthropy supervisor until December, and then the new president can put someone in charge. I have been a 'fill-in' supervisor for years and the only other available supervisor is Nancy Allen who handles everything for Orangewood. Nancy has so much on her plate that Lynda felt it wasn't fair to ask her to do more.

I wanted to get to know what we had in storage and that is when I found all the quilts for the firefighters. We had enough for two shifts. Vanda and Mike took 13 quilts to the station. That left us with 13 to store. I made a decision to go ahead and deliver the remaining quilts rather than put them back in storage. Marily delivered them this past weekend. They couldn't believe we had completed so many. They were each looking at them and trying to claim the one they wanted for themselves.

It is a good feeling to complete a worthwhile project like this. These are the people that come to help us when we can't breathe or have fallen. We wanted to thank them and I believe they realize this and feel good that the neighborhood wants to thank them in our special Crazy Quilters' way.

All of you who participated in this project should feel good about it and the work you did. Apparently, one of you has a quilt in progress. We can bring this to the station to use for an incoming new firefighter, or we do have a few other projects that we work on. A quilt of the size needed for the firefighters is also the size that could be used for the Orangewood foster children program – see Nancy if this is your interest. Or it might be right for our veterans.

Thanks to all of you for the work you do.
