SEPTEMBER PROGRAM

We will be starting our new year with a program of demonstrations on tricks that will help with your quilting. I have the following people showing you how to do the different things we quilters need to do to make a good quilt and to make the work easier.

Moore's Sewing Center will send their people to demonstrate the important things that should be done to your machine. They will have a machine to demonstrate how to clean it, oil it (if necessary) and keep it in good running condition. They will show the use of different needles and threads and have some for sale. These are the important steps we should all learn if we want our machines to work properly. Come with questions.

Mickey Charleston has taught quilting for many years and will demonstrate the various uses of the basic rulers. She doesn't need all the new rulers when one or two will accomplish her needs.

Nancy Allen is our expert in the quilt room at Clubhouse 4 on making and applying a binding. Nancy will show how to piece the strips, fold, iron and put the binding on the quilt.

Vicki Nardone will give a demonstration on how to free motion a quilt on your home machine.

Mary Lee Turner doesn't like pins, but she can show you how to baste a quilt with ease.

This should be an interesting program to start our year with a clean machine, proper needles and threads, know the use of our rulers, bind our quilts, perhaps take on free motion and put the pins aside and baste our quilts. See you September 14 at Clubhouse 7. Meeting starts at 1 pm.

We will also have a special presentation of the quilts for our firefighters. We wanted 13 quilts for the first shift of firefighters--we have them, all 13 and we will show and present them to the firefighters. Now we have to work on the second shift. Wonderful work ladies and thanks to Lynda Guthrie.

Each month, you will pick up an envelope (or two) containing the fabric and pattern for that month's block, returning it the next month finished or unfinished (finished, I hope). I will have a display board at the general meeting showing the completed blocks. The envelopes will be available directly in front of the display board and I plan to be at the table to answer any questions.

Each envelope will be numbered. I ask you to sign your name beside the corresponding number in the notebook. That way, when number so and so doesn't come back, I know who to give a jingle to.

This past year, we concentrated so heavily on large quilts for our veterans and firemen that our on-going philanthropies of Orangewood and our own Social Services have sadly lagged. We used to send Orangewood 30 quilts twice a year. We've got to hustle to even achieve half that amount. Orangewood is happy for any size quilts from receiving blankets to bed-size. We also accept gently used blankets and quilts to donate to the homeless through South County Outreach.
